Clarke, his Special Educator, "when it was difficult motivating him without a few challenging behaviors, but now he follows directions, and works independently." In terms of learning, Brenden's great at math, and working on factors up to 6, and shows a propensity to counting money and making change.

"In terms of social skills," says Fielding-Clarke, "he's become quite the conversationalist, and will sit and chat with one of our Teacher Assistants at length about his weekends, and new trains he's seen, and he's more often making requests for help, and better expressing himself."

Brenden's parents are excited about what they see, too. Says Debbie, his mom, "Brenden can be easily described as a happy, considerate, and spirited boy, who is gently emerging as a social butterfly due to the immense increase of his meaningful communication skills."

Debbie remarks that family and friends see Brenden's abilities increasing every day, and that his entire team at Spectrum Services have consistently dedicated their time and energy to increase his skills. "Our family cannot thank Spectrum Services enough for getting him to the level he is at today."

Debbie adds, "the sky's the limit for this guy and, hey, if you need any questions answered about trains, Brenden is your guy. He's a rail fan at heart, and you might say it definitely 'keeps him on track."

Klock Kingston Foundation Provides Art Lessons to Our Students

A \$20,000 grant from the Klock Kingston Foundation is helping Spectrum Services establish a permanent Art Program for our students on the autism spectrum. The benefits of art education to individuals with autism are many, and allow people with autism to use their already visually-minded brains to communicate through artistic media. Through the use of art, individuals on the spectrum can express ideas and process memories they might otherwise not be able to do verbally.

Funds are being used for a dedicated art instructor, Gillian, who works closely with each classroom in planning projects, selecting various media to work with that will best stimulate sensory awareness of our students on the spectrum, improving social skills, and heightening communication skills using art. Art education provides opportunities for positive experiences that can translate into enhanced classroom performance and increased ability to gain from educational services. Art education can also be adapted to support academic, social, speech and language, or emotional goals and objectives.

For April's Autism Acceptance Month, use your Facebook page to help raise funds to support the life-changing work done at Spectrum Services. Setting up a fundraiser is as easy as A, B, and C

- A) First, log into your Facebook page, find on the upper right of your page the dark blue, downward arrow that clicks your pages dropdown box. In that, you'll see "Create Fundraiser," and click on that to bring up the Create a Fundraiser pop-up box, and then click "Get Started."
- B) On the next box, you'll be given options on who you're raising funds for, from which you'll click the middle option for Nonprofit, which opens a box allowing you to select what nonprofit. In the text box up top, type "Center for Spectrum Services," which will bring the Spectrum Services fundraising option. Click that, and choose how much you want to raise, and when your fundraiser should end. We suggest the end of April, so it runs throughout Autism Awareness Month.
- **C)** That opens the "Tell your story" box, which already has text, but which you can edit to tell your story. Perhaps you're raising funds in honor of someone you love, or maybe you have a birthday or celebration coming up, and instead of gifts, prefer donations to your fundraiser. Then, your next option is to choose a graphic, and we suggest the Spectrum Services Logo. Then, click "Create" to start your fundraising.
